May 10, 2011 Minutes

- I. Stephanie Morgan called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. Thank you notes from the staff were shared.
- II. Minutes of the March 15, 2011 meeting were reviewed. Linda Rodeman moved to approve the minutes as written. Amy Stiles seconded. Minutes were approved.

III. Reports

- A. Neff School Committee Liaison
 - 1. Fundraising Activities
 - a. Frankenmuth

The new die cuts and new die cut machine have been received.

b. Box Tops for Education (Kristen Parker/Jennifer Hughes)

Mrs. Promer's PM class (523 Box Tops collected) and Mrs. Browning's

PM class (519 Box Tops collected) won the last Box Tops contest. They received JELL-O treats for their collection efforts. 4,042 total Box Tops were collected for that contest. The final collection contest is underway. It is a "Fill a Sheet, Get a Treat" contest which ends on Friday, May 20.

c. Labels for Education (Amy Stiles)

Amy reported that we will end up with a total of about 7, 700 Labels for the year. A note has been sent to teachers for their input on what the points should be used to get.

d. Original ArtWorks (Amanda Boyd/Kristen Clark)

The project went great. There were no returns or incorrect orders. Some of the teachers said that the kids really enjoyed doing this project. It was a great success. 308 items were sold for a profit of \$1,011.42.

e. Miscellaneous (Meijer, Target, Felpausch)

We received a check from Meijer Rewards for \$104.35. It was noted that Target sends a check just once a year.

B. Treasurer

1. Budget Report

Treasurer Linda Rodeman reported on current account activity. A check was received from Box Tops – the check less receipts (for prizes and postage) was \$1,455.12. We are over our projected amount for Box Tops for the year. \$104.35 was received from Meijer Rewards. Under Miscellaneous Income, we had popcorn sales of \$273.00; this amount less the cost of the popcorn (\$69.98) netted us \$203.02. Net profit from ArtWorks Originals was \$1,011.42. \$62.92 was spent on Field Trips (Mrs. Pohl and Mrs. Garza/Fenner Nature Center). \$482.12 was spent for various Teacher Allowances. \$235.87 was spent from Classroom Programs & Materials for seat sacks for Mrs. Mulholland's class. \$128.04 was spent from Classroom Programs & Materials for Handwriting Without Tears materials for Mrs. Bower's class. Both of these items were approved at the March meeting. We are

currently over budget for this line item. \$224.55 was spent from the All School Party line item for live butterfly larva for every classroom in the school. From Approved Wish List Items, \$56.90 was spent for backordered books for the book room, and \$252.20 was spent for wiggle seats to be used throughout the school. From Staff Appreciation, \$196.22 was spent for gift cards to Barnes & Noble for the teachers and other treats for Teacher Appreciation Week. From PTO Expenses, \$148.40 was spent on insurance (a 40/60 split with Beagle PTO).

Total income is \$2,773.91. Total expenses are \$1,787.22. Current cash balance is \$10,887.45.

2. Requests for Funding – no requests for funding were presented.

IV. Events

A. Recently Completed Events

1. Bowling at Royal Scot – March 20 (Stephanie Morgan)

There was a constant stream of people bowling. It wasn't crowded. People had a good time. Many people were able to bowl a second game.

2. Popcorn (Kim Lawens)

The first of two popcorn days was on Friday, April 15. It was decided that all students would receive popcorn (if their classroom was participating) regardless of whether or not they paid. The next popcorn day is on Friday, May 20.

3. Neff at the Movies – April 17 (Kelly Tackett)

This event was not well attended. It may have been because a newly released movie was not being shown.

4. Teacher Appreciation Week – May 2-5 (Amy Hirschman, Laura Wotruba)

It was a great week. The teachers were very appreciative. On Monday, volunteers brought in assorted breakfast treats. On Tuesday, Junior Mints were delivered to each staff member's mailbox (60 in all) with a note tied on it with a ribbon. On Wednesday, there was a dessert bar (provided by volunteers) in the lounge. On Thursday, Livesavers (with an appreciation poem) were distributed via staff mailboxes. The notes/drawings send in by students were also distributed on this day. On Friday, flowers were personally delivered to each teacher and staff member in the building. Teachers were also given a \$10 gift card to Barnes & Noble. Because of all the donations, only about \$195.00 (\$170.00 for the gift cards and about \$25 for the lifesavers) was used from the PTO budget.
